The Sermon

The Nicene Creed (CONGREGATION STANDS AS ABLE)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; He suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again

in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,

and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, Who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, And the life of the world to come. Amen.

For all who proclaim the Gospel, and all who seek the truth.

For Michael our Presiding Bishop and Susan our Bishop, and for all bishops and other clergy;

#### For all who serve God in his church.

For the special needs and concerns of this congregation.

PRAYER REQUESTS ARE READ, PAUSING AS THE PEOPLE VOICE ADDITIONAL PETITIONS.

Hear us, Lord;

#### For your mercy is great.

We thank you, Lord, for all the blessings of this life.

SILENCE. THE PEOPLE MAYADD THEIR OWN THANKSGIVINGS.

We exalt you, O God our King;

#### And praise your name for ever and ever.

We pray for all who have died, that they may have a place in your eternal kingdom.

SILENCE. THE PEOPLE MAY ADD THEIR OWN PETITIONS.

Lord, let your loving kindness be upon them; Who put their trust in you. Amen.

#### **Confession of Sin**

CELEBRANT: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

CELEBRANT AND PEOPLE:

Have mercy upon us, most merciful Father; in your compassion forgive us our sins, known and unknown, things done and left undone; and so uphold us by your Spirit

#### that we may live and serve you in newness of life, to the honor and glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE CELEBRANT CONCLUDES WITH AN ABSOLUTION OR A SUITABLE COLLECT.

CELEBRANT: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

THE CELEBRANT PROCEEDS:


It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

#### THE PEOPLE STAND OR KNEEL.

THE CELEBRANT CONTINUES:

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

AT THE FOLLOWING WORDS CONCERNING THE BREAD, THE CELEBRANT IS TO HOLD IT, OR LAY A HAND UPON IT; AND AT THE WORDS CONCERNING THE CUP, TO HOLD OR PLACE A HAND UPON THE CUP AND ANY OTHER VESSEL CONTAINING WINE TO BE CONSECRATED.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

CELEBRANT AND PEOPLE:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. THE CELEBRANT CONTINUES.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, Oh Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **AMEN.** 

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

#### The Breaking of the Bread

THE CELEBRANT BREAKS THE CONSECRATED BREAD.

CELEBRANT: Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

PEOPLE: Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

THE CELEBRANT SAYS THE FOLLOWING INVITATION:

The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

THE MINISTERS RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT IN BOTH KINDS, AND THEN IMMEDIATELY DELIVER IT TO THE PEOPLE.

ALL ARE WELCOME TO RECEIVE COMMUNION. IF YOU PREFER NOT TO RECEIVE COMMUNION YOU ARE INVITED TO COME FORWARD FOR A BLESSING, CROSSING YOUR ARMS OVER YOUR CHEST. GLUTEN FREE IS AVAILABLE UPON REQUEST.

THE PRIEST DISTRIBUTES THE BREAD. THE MINISTER THEN OFFERS THE WINE. YOU MAY CONSUME THE BREAD AND SIP FROM THE CHALICE. OR, THE MINISTER WILL TAKE THE BREAD FROM YOUR HAND, INTINCT IT, AND PLACE IT BACK.

#### **Post-Communion Hymn**

CELEBRANT: Let us pray.

CELEBRANT AND PEOPLE: Eternal God, our beginning and our end, accompany us on this day's journey. Dawn on our darkness, open our eyes to praise you for your creation and to see the work you set before us today. Take us and use us to bring others the new life you give in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### Blessing

CELEBRANT: May God who clothes the lilies and feeds the birds of the sky, who leads the lambs to pasture and the deer to water, who multiplied loaves and fishes and changed water into wine, lead us, feed us, multiply us, and change us to reflect the glory of our Creator now and through all eternity; and the blessing of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit remain with you always. Amen.
